A Regular Meeting of the SAFETY REVIEW BOARD of the City of Port St. Lucie was called to order by Chairman Perkins on February 11, 2016, at 9:00 a.m., in the 3rd Floor Training Room, Port St. Lucie City Hall, 121 SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, Port St. Lucie, Florida.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES - DECEMBER 17, 2015

There being no corrections, the minutes were unanimously approved.

4. REVIEW OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION CLAIM LOG

12/04/2015 Code Enforcement – Code Enforcement Officer – The employee was in the back of a City pickup truck handing boxes to another employee on the ground to be put in storage. The employee's right arm began to hurt. The employee sustained a strain to the arm. There was medical, (15) days of loss time, and (48) days of restricted duty as of 12/5/2015.

Mr. Power said, "She is still out of work. On this claim, the employees were in the back of a truck, handing each other boxes, and she ended up straining her shoulder."

12/09/2015 Utilities – Billing Clerk/Utility Billing – The employee reached across the mail machine to unjam an envelope that was stuck in the equipment. While doing so, she scraped her arm on the edge of a small monitor. The monitor was inspected for sharp edges and none were found. The employee sustained a scrape to the arm. There was no lost time or medical.

Mr. Power said, "They do not use that monitor on the machine, so they are deciding whether or not to take the monitor off."

12/14/2015 City Clerk's Office – Deputy City Clerk – The employee was standing at the top of the stairs in the Council Chambers. When the employee turned to go down the steps, she missed the first step and stumbled. She used her hands and arms to regain her balance, but ended up falling against the podium and sustaining injuries. The employee sustained a strain to the hand, contusion on both arms, and strain to the wrist. There was medical, no lost time, and (7) days of restricted duty.

12/16/2015 Parks and Recreation – Park Leader – The employee was hedge trimming with a gas trimmer and struck a tough piece of wood. The trimmer bounced back and struck the employee in his left thigh. The employee sustained a laceration to the thigh. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

12/16/2015 Police – School Crossing Guard – The employee was bitten by ants after stepping in an ant hill while on her post. The employee sustained insect bites to the leg. There was no medical or lost time.

12/16/2015 Public Works – Maintenance Worker – The employee lifted a water cooler in the morning and experienced a twinge of pain in his left wrist. As the day progressed, while performing several normal duties such as pegging liner, pulling lines, digging and raking the employee noticed that the pain became progressively worse. Eventually, the employee had trouble grasping items or twisting his wrist. The employee sustained a sprain to the wrist. There was medical, no lost time, and (21) days of restricted duty.

12/22/2015 Police – Police Officer – The employee, along with another employee were escorting a subject when she refused to walk. She suddenly went limp causing the employee to lose balance and fall to the ground. The employee used his arm to break his fall sustaining scratches to his arm and hand. He also strained his wrist. The employee sustained a sprain to the wrist. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

12/22/2015 Utilities – Maintenance Mechanic – After cleaning up the caustic soda table, the employee leaned on the table. The table was wet and the employee came in contact with residual caustic material on the table. The employee already cleaned up and removed his PPE when he made contact with the material. The employee sustained a burn to the groin area. There was no lost time or medical.

12/22/2015 Animal Control – Animal Control Officer – While trying to apprehend an injured cat, the employee fell and hit his left leg on the transfer crate. The employee sustained three small scratches on his left shin. The employee sustained a wound to the leg. There was no lost time or medical.

12/28/2015 Utilities – Water Distribution Systems Operator 3 – The employee was walking to a meter box and stepped on something that caused him to lose his balance. The employee twisted his leg and knee. Shortly after the incident, he could hear a clicking noise from his knee when he walked. That night he had swelling at the knee and sought medical attention the following day on 12/29/2015. The employee sustained a sprain to the knee. There was medical, no lost time, and (38) days of restricted duty. As of 2/5/2016, employee remains on restricted duty.

Mr. Power said, “There will be lost time associated with this claim, as we move forward.”

12/29/2015 Police – Records Specialist – The employee tripped on a piece of torn carpeting in the filing area of records storage. As she fell, she struck her shoulder against the metal filing system. There is torn carpeting in several areas of the filing area, and the correction was initiated by the department for carpet replacement. The employee sustained a sprain to the shoulder. There was medical, no lost time, and (38) days of restricted duty as of 2/5/2016. The carpet was replaced on 2/8/2016.

Mr. Power said, “There will be lost time on this claim, as well.”

1/3/2016 Utilities – Chief Operator – The employee is required to rake solids that are deposited into a metal dumpster, which is later removed by Waste Pro when it is full. While raking the solids in the dumpster, the employee attempted to knock down and evenly distribute the solids in the dumpster. The employee felt a pull in his right shoulder. The employee sustained a strain in the shoulder. There was no lost time or medical.

Mr. Power asked, “What is his position?” Ms. Sisilli answered, “He is a wastewater operator. When your waste comes into the waste water plant, it goes through the headworks. At the beginning of the headworks, there is a bar strain that separates paper products. Once it is drained, it falls into this dumpster, and forms a little hill. The employees have to rake it down to allow more solids to come out. We cannot move the dumpster, because there is a wall there.”

1/4/2016 Parks and Recreation – Building and Facility Maintenance Supervisor – The employee was in a vehicle heading back to the Parks and Recreation compound when sand or another foreign object got into his left eye. The employee sustained a foreign body to the eye. There was medical and restricted duty.

1/5/2016 Police – Police Officer – The employee was handcuffing a subject and came in contact with the subject’s blood. The employee sustained exposure to body fluids on their hands. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

1/5/2016 Police – Sergeant – While preparing for an in-office interview, the employee pulled a circular table to the interviews location and felt pain in his left shoulder. The employee sustained a sprain to the shoulder. There was no lost time or medical.

1/12/2016 Utilities – Warehouse Technician – The employee was walking backwards and pulling a cart with items. The employee tripped on a pallet of pumps. The employee fell backwards, but did not land on the ground. The incident did not result in any injury at the time of the incident. The incident serves as a reminder to maintain good housekeeping, and to be aware of your surroundings.

1/13/2016 Police – Police Officer – During SWAT training, the employee was sprinting and sprained his left knee. The employee sustained a sprain to the knee. There was medical, no lost time, and (4) days of restricted duty.

1/13/2016 Police – Police Officer – While training, the employee was running and slipped in the mud during an exercise. His right shin struck the bumper of a truck and started to swell. The employee sustained a contusion to the shin. There was medical, no lost time, and (17) days of restricted duty.

1/13/2016 Building – Code Compliance Officer – The employee indicate that after trying to move a laptop stationed at a podium with her finger, her wrist started hurting. The pain in her wrist became progressively worse throughout the day. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to the wrist. There was medical, no lost time, and (6) days of restricted duty.

1/15/2016 Police – Police Officer – While seated in his patrol car, the employee was cutting open a printer box with a pocket knife and cut his left ring finger. The employee sustained a cut on the hand. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

1/15/2016 Public Works – Crew Leader – The employee was putting a dead hog in the bucket of the Gradall with the help of another employee. His hand slipped off of the hog's leg and he lost his balance. The employee hit the Gradall's metal bucket with his head. The employee sustained a laceration to the head. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

1/19/2016 Police – Evidence Manager – The employee was lifting a safe to place it on a skid and felt pain in his back. There was no lost time or medical.

1/21/2016 Police – Police Officer – The employee, along with another employee, were attempting to place a resisting subject into handcuffs. As the subject was resisting, the employee had his thumb bent. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to the thumb. There was medical, no lost time, and (7) days of restricted duty.

1/25/2016 Utilities – Field Technician – The employee was walking around a newly installed grinder tank when the ground began to collapse. He was approximately 2 feet

from the edge and he made an effort to regain his balance. The employee strained his back in his effort not to fall. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to the back. There was no lost time or medical.

1/26/2016 Police – Sergeant – An employee, while in his vehicle responding to an emergency call for service, was struck by another vehicle as he was passing through an intersection. The employee was running with lights and sirens as he was passing through the intersection. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to multiple body parts. There was medical, no lost time, and (6) days of restricted duty.

1/26/2016 Utilities – Laboratory Technician – The employee had been taking water samples for water quality and went to remove the hose from a hose bib, and felt a pop in his left thumb. The employee sustained a sprain to the thumb. There was medical, no lost time, and (7) days of restricted duty.

1/28/2016 Utilities – Lead Electrician – While the employee was walking into a trailer carrying a wood cabinet, he struck his head on the cross beam of the trailer. It had been raining out and the employee was watching where he was walking, because the ramp was wet. The employee sustained a contusion to the head. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

1/28/2016 Police – Police Officer – The employee scraped his hand on the pavement while attempting to secure a subject who was actively resisting. The employee sustained a wound to the finger. There was no lost time or medical.

1/28/2016 Police – Police Officer – The employee was in his patrol vehicle traveling through the intersection of S.E. Veteran's Memorial Parkway and S.E. Port St. Lucie Boulevard, when he was struck by a vehicle heading west on Port St. Lucie Boulevard. The employee sustained a strain to multiple body parts. There was medical, no lost time, and (5) days of restricted duty as of 2/5/2016.

1/28/2015 Utilities – Laboratory Technician – While washing lab dishes, the employee jammed their foot on the bottom of the cabinet. The employee sustained a contusion to the foot. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

1/30/2016 Utilities – Electrician Journeymen – After moving furniture all day on 1/30/2016, the employee felt sore. On Sunday, his left arm was in pain and on Monday the employee went to the clinic, because the pain persisted. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to the shoulder. There was medical, no lost time, and (5) days of restricted duty as of 2/5/2016.

1/31/2016 Police – Police Sergeant – Employee was spit in the face by a combative subject. The employee sustained exposure to body fluids to the face. There was no lost time, but there was medical.

5. REVIEW OF AUTO LOSS CLAIM LOG

12/07/2015 Claim #15042 – Stephen Cordes – Parks and Recreation – While driving Workman #296 on the rear patio of the Civic Center, the employee attempted to make a wide turn to avoid a park bench and struck the metal fence. There was no damage to workman.

12/08/2015 Claim #15029 – Kayla Ruede - Police – While driving to back-up an officer, the employee turned the corner at Wolverine Road & Bachelor and struck a cement button. There was no damage to Unit #74.

Mr. Dolan said, “Cement buttons are the round, dome shaped pieces that go around the property line.”

12/13/2015 Claim #15031 – William Winn - Police – While backing into the driveway at 133 S.E. Fallon Drive, the employee accidentally struck a landscaping rock with the front passenger corner of Unit #259. The department will not repair.

12/16/2015 Claim #15038 – Eric Druga – Police – While on his way to follow-up on a case. The employee attempted to maneuver Unit #71 from one lane to another at the St. James guard gate. In doing so, the employee drove over a curb with a small protruding metal post. The metal punctured a hole in the bottom of the oil pan. There were damages in the amount of \$441.20, which were paid for by the department.

12/18/2015 Claim #15034 – Robert Penny – Police – Unit #249 sustained a minor crack in the rear driver’s side tail light and dent in the quarter panel when the vehicle backed into a metal hand rail. There were damages in the amount of \$200, which were paid for by the department. There were no damages to the hand rail.

12/20/2015 Claim #15033 – Brian Boice – Police – While turning onto S.E. Hillmoor Drive from S.E. Tiffany Avenue in Unit #181, the employee struck the median damaging the driver’s side front tire. There were damages in the amount of \$200, which were paid for by the department.

12/21/2015 Claim #15039 – David Butterworth – Police – While driving on King’s Highway at night, the employee struck a piece of road debris damaging the brush guard to Unit #539. There were damages in the amount of \$200, which were paid for by the department.

12/23/2015 Claim #15035 – Paul Burke – Public Works – Employee pulled up to US 1 & Village Green Drive in PW-5976 preparing to turn right onto US 1. The employee thought the car in front of him drove off, but it didn’t and instead rear ended the vehicle. No damage to PW-5976.

12/27/2015 Claim #15036 – Nicholas Sistarelli – Police – While driving on I-95 in route to the Police Department, a bird struck the upper right portion of Unit #147’s windshield, causing the windshield to crack. There were damages in the amount of \$200, which were paid for by the department.

01/16/2016 Claim #15053 – Stephen Zebrauskas - Utilities – While driving down Avens Street, the employee’s passenger side mirror made contact with the open mailbox door of 502 N.W. Avens Street. There was no damage to truck UM-6525.

1/19/2016 Claim #15056 – Ben Wilkins – Utilities – While driving truck UWD-0104 in a grassy area of Well Station #3, the employee’s vehicle became stuck. The truck was towed by FVS. There were damages in the amount of \$75, which were paid for by the department.

1/19/2016 Claim #15043 – Mark Pisano – Utilities – While driving truck in a grassy area of Well Station #3, the employee’s vehicle became stuck. The truck was towed by FVS. There were damages in the amount of \$75, which were paid for by the department.

1/21/2016 Claim #15046 – Jason Decesare – Utilities – While working in the area of 747 E. Prima Vista Boulevard, the employee backed Utilities truck #UI-8707 into the mailbox at the said address. There was no damage to UI-8707.

1/21/2016 Claim #15044 – David Lichtenfels – Animal Control – While at the eastbound traffic light on Port St. Lucie Boulevard and Cameo Boulevard, a vehicle attempted to merge right and struck Animal Control truck #AC-6038. The truck sustained a broken driver’s side mirror, a dent in the driver’s side quarter panel, and a three foot strip of paint transfer on the driver’s side rear quarter panel. There were damages in the amount of \$572.01, and Subrogation.

1/26/2016 Claim #15047 – Joseph Byrne – Police – While on detail, the employee was following, “Area Wide Protection Inc.” in Unit #175, who was placing MOT cones for a project on US 1, when the employee rear ended the trailer in front of him. Unit #175 sustained damage to the passenger side front end of the vehicle. There were damages paid for by the department, and Ascension.

1/27/2016 Claim #15051 – Terry Russell – Police – While traveling on Airoso Boulevard preparing to make a U-turn at Port St. Lucie Boulevard in Unit #127, another City vehicle in front of him stopped abruptly causing Unit #127 to rear end him. There were damages in the amount of \$1,584.45, which were paid for by the department and Ascension.

1/27/2016 Claim #15049 – Brian Thompson – Police – While stopped in traffic, the employee’s right side review mirror was struck. There was no damage to Unit #172.

1/27/2016 Claim #15050 – Daniel Dalia - While traveling on Airoso Boulevard attempting to make a U-turn at Port St. Lucie Boulevard, the employee’s vehicle Unit #248 began to rub against the curb. To prevent the vehicle from becoming damaged, the employee stepped on the brakes and was rear ended by the Police unit behind him. Cosmetic damage only. The department opted not to repair it.

6. REVIEW OF GENERAL LIABILITY CLAIM LOG

12/17/2015 Claim #15024 – Eric Druga – Police – Police Officer – While maneuvering Unit #71 from one lane to another at the St. James guard gate, the employee drove over a curb with a small protruding metal post. The metal punctured a hole in the bottom of the oil pan, causing oil to leak onto the privately owned road.

12/21/2015 Claim #15017 – Bobby Quattlebaum – Utilities – Supervisor – While using a clog buster to find and break free a clog in a gravity sewer line, the clog buster turned the wrong way and ended up pushing water back into the house, via the sunken shower. There was Ascension. Bobby's name is used at the placeholder. Damages are to be determined. Mr. Power said, "I believe the damages are around \$15,000."

12/23/2015 Claim #15019 – Paul Burke - Public Works – Traffic Operations Electrician - Employee pulled up to US 1 & Village Green Drive in PW-5976, preparing to turn right onto US 1. The employee thought the car in front of him drove off, but it didn't and instead rear ended the vehicle, causing minor damage. There were damages in the amount of \$998, and Ascension.

1/16/2016 Claim #15029 – Stephen Zebrauskas - Utilities – Maintenance Mechanic - While driving down Avens Street, the employee's passenger side mirror made contact with the open mailbox door of 502 NW Avens Street, breaking it off its hinge. There were damages in the amount of \$19.99, and Ascension.

1/20/2016 Claim #15026 – Joseph Cassaniti - Police – Police Officer – While driving the SWAT vehicle on Prima Vista Boulevard, the employee attempted to change lanes and didn't see the vehicle in the adjacent lane, forcing it off of the road. Contact between vehicles was not made. There were damages in the amount of \$3,125.01, and Ascension.

1/22/2016 Claim #15025 – Jason Decesare - Utilities - Field Trainee – While working in the area of 747 E. Prima Vista Boulevard, the employee backed Utilities truck #UI-8707 into the mailbox at the said address, damaging its post. EMI is to make contact with the homeowner. The voicemail is not set up and a letter was sent, but returned undeliverable.

1/23/2016 Claim #15028 – Jeffrey Santamaria - Utilities - Maintenance Mechanic - While using a backhoe, the employee backed into the mailbox at 1311 SW Halford Avenue, breaking the box's brackets. The department repaired the broken brackets.

1/26/2016 Claim #15027 – Joseph Byrne – Police – Police Officer – While on detail, the employee was following, "Area Wide Protection Inc." in Unit #175, who was placing MOT cones for a project on US 1, when the employee rear ended the trailer in front of him. Unit #175 sustained damage to the passenger side front end of the vehicle. There was Ascension.
