A Regular Meeting of the SAFETY REVIEW BOARD of the City of Port St. Lucie was called to order by Vice Chair Frye on June 16, 2016, at 9:00 a.m., in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Training Room, Port St. Lucie City Hall, 121 SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, Port St. Lucie, Florida.

**3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – APRIL 21, 2016**

There being no corrections, the minutes were unanimously approved.

**4. REVIEW OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION CLAIM LOG**

04/03/16     Police - Police Officer - While attempting to subdue a combative subject, the employee was exposed to the subject's blood. The employee sustained exposure to the hands. There was no lost time or medical.

04/06/16     Police - Police Officer - The employee was in the center lane heading east on Port St. Lucie Boulevard going straight through U.S. 1 when a vehicle that was in the northern most turn lane for a southbound turn onto U.S. 1 crossed into the employee's through-lane causing the employee to strike the other vehicle. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to the neck and contusions on his arms. There was medical, but no lost time.

04/15/16 Utilities - Field Technician Trainee - During an installation of a new house service line, the employee was standing next to a trench that had just been dug. As he was preparing to enter the hole, the dirt gave way and the employee fell into the hole straining his knee. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to the knee. There was medical, and as of June 13, there were 54 days of restricted duty. Mr. Power noted, "There will probably be lost time on this claim."

04/16/16 Police - Police Officer - While driving southbound on Rosser, a vehicle ran a red light at Aledo, T-boning the employee's patrol vehicle on the front driver's side. As a result of the motor vehicle accident (MVA), the employee experienced pain in his head, neck, chest, both knees and entire right side of his body. The employee sustained contusions to multiple body parts. There was medical, and as of June 13, there were 56 days of restricted duty.

04/20/16 Building - Address Technician - While exiting the City vehicle, a wasp stung the employee's right shoulder. The wasp's nest was located in the door jamb. The employee sustained an insect bite to the right arm. There was medical, but no lost time.

04/21/16 Police - Police Officer - While utilizing a ram to breach the front door of a residence, the glass pane in the door shattered, cutting the employee's left hand. The employee sustained a laceration to the right hand. There was medical, but no lost time.

04/22/16 Police - Police Officer - While on routine patrol, the employee located a small kitten in the middle of the roadway. The kitten bit the employee on her left index finger. The wound was cleaned and the employee continued with her shift. At the end of her shift, the employee noticed that her finger was red and swollen so she sought medical treatment. The employee sustained an animal bite to her finger. There was medical, but no lost time, and Animal Control was notified.

Mr. Power said, "Initially, with that claim, she didn't think anything about it, and she found what they thought to be the mother of the kitten. Then, later on when her finger got red and swollen, they wondered if the animal had rabies. So, she had to go through a series of rabies injections. Had she kept the animal long enough to have it tested, she would not have had to have gone through that."

04/23/16 Public Works - Project Coordinator - While removing an event banner, the employee cut his hand with the pocket knife he was using. The employee sustained a wound to his hand. There was no medical or lost time.

04/24/16 Police - Police Officer - The employee, after trying to secure a resistant subject, was exposed to the subject's blood. The blood from the subject was noticed on the employee's hands. No gloves were being worn at the time of the incident. The employee sustained exposure to body fluids on his hands. There was no medical or lost time.

04/25/16 Public Works - Project Coordinator - The employee was walking down a concrete weir to clean debris. Mr. Power explained, "That is kind of like a stop-gate where the canals are." Ms. Sisilli stated, "It's a channel." When the employee went to

step on a concrete cap, he ended up slipping on the concrete thaw because it was wet and slimy. Ms. Sisilli asked, "What is a thaw?" Mr. Power responded, "I don't know. It's a misprint." The employee's right leg landed on the metal strip on the top of the weir and he sustained a laceration. The employee sustained a laceration to his shin. There was medical, and nine days of restricted duty.

04/25/16 Building - Code Compliance Specialist - The employee was bitten by an unknown insect while at the Cameo dump site. The employee sustained an insect bite to the arm. There was no medical or lost time.

04/26/16 Utilities - Utilities Inspector - The employee, while conducting an inspection, slipped on loose rock and fell to his right knee. After the fall, he noticed a cut on his knee. The employee sustained a laceration to his knee. There was no medical or lost time.

04/28/16 Utilities - Waster Distribution Systems Operator 3 - While removing a "hold down nut" from an old fire hydrant, the wrench slipped and hit the employee on the right thigh. The employee sustained a contusion/bruise on the leg. There was no medical or lost time. Ms. Sisilli noted, "I didn't know it was old. It didn't say that in the report. I'm just saying." Mr. Dolan stated, "Leave it in."

05/01/16 Police - Police Officer - The employee was riding in an ambulance to assist with the transport of an elderly female patient. The patient became combative and bit the employee on her right forearm. The employee sustained a human bite to her arm. There was medical, but no lost time.

05/03/16 Parks and Recreation - Park Leader - While trimming and picking up palm fronds, the employee was pricked in his left hand and wrist areas by the frond's thorns. The employee sustained wounds to his hand and wrist. There was no medical or lost time.

05/03/16 Utilities - Field Technician Trainee - The employee had been digging with a shovel. He struck something hard, possibly a root, with the shovel and jolted his arm. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to his arm. There was medical, and five days of restricted duty.

05/04/16 Police - Police Officer - The employee, along with another employee, responded to a disruptive restaurant patron. The employee strained his shoulder while struggling with the subject. The employee sustained a strain/sprain to his shoulder. There was medical, and 21 days of restricted duty.

05/04/16 Police - Police Officer - The employee, along with another employee, responded to a disruptive restaurant patron. The employee bruised his right knee while struggling with the subject. The employee sustained a contusion to his right knee. There was no medical or lost time.

## **SAFETY REVIEW BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

**JUNE 16, 2016**

05/05/16 Building - Code Compliance Specialist - While inspecting a vacant home, a bee stung the employee on his left calf. The employee sustained an insect bite to his leg. There was no medical or lost time.

05/10/16 Utilities - Maintenance Mechanic - While pumping down lift station NP45, the hose blew, causing sewage to splash onto the employee. Sewage got on most of his clothing, face and eyes. The employee sustained exposure to sewage on multiple body parts, including his eyes. There was medical, but no lost time.

05/13/16 Parks and Recreation - Equipment Operator - The employee was unloading the bobcat off the trailer. He went to unhook the chain and used a smooth round bar to step on to brace himself. He was reaching forward and was extending his arm when his right foot slipped off the bar. He twisted and fell on his back, striking the attachment claw as he fell. The employee sustained a contusion to his back and leg. There was medical, two days of lost time and six days of restricted duty.

05/14/16 Utilities - Field Technician Trainee - The employee was removing a pump out of a tank when he felt pain in the muscle on the right side of his chest. The employee sustained a strain/sprain of his chest. There was no medical or lost time.

05/14/16 Police - Police Officer - The employee had responded to a wellness check at a residence, along with the fire department. In attempting to silence the alarm, a large battery that was located in an electrical alarm panel fell out of the panel and struck the employee in the right eye. The panel had been opened by a firefighter in an attempt to disconnect or reset the homeowner's alarm. The employee sustained a contusion to the eye. There was medical, but no lost time.

05/16/16 Utilities - Water Distribution System Operator 3 - The employee complained of pain in his right shoulder after pressure washing some of the roadway. The employee sustained a strain to his shoulder. There was no medical or lost time.

05/18/16 Police - Police Officer - The employee had responded to a call for service and was standing in a garage when lightning struck close by. The employee's left leg immediately locked up but then released. After the event, the employee felt a tingle in his leg but had no residual pain. The employee sustained no physical injury to his leg. There was no medical or lost time.

05/19/16 Utilities - Maintenance Mechanic - The employee was pulling a pump out of a tank. He did not realize that the rope was connected to the pump and jerked his arm and shoulder to pull the pump out. He pulled a muscle in his left arm and shoulder. The employee sustained a strain to his arm and shoulder. There was no medical or lost time.

05/20/16 Utilities - Field Technician - While the employee was getting into the pump truck, he slipped and fell on his left ankle. A contributing factor was the wet conditions at the time of the incident. The employee sustained a sprain to his ankle. There was medical, and 13 days of restricted duty.

05/25/16 Police - Sergeant - The employee indicated that he had engaged in defensive tactics training which required a lot of twisting motions to his back. During the night, the employee started to experience increasing pain to his lower back. He sought medical attention on May 29, 2016, and was placed on restricted duty. The employee sustained a strain to his back. There was medical, and 15 days of restricted duty.

05/26/16 Police - Police Officer - After taking a resistant subject to the ground, the employee sustained a scratch on his right hand from the handcuffs. The employee sustained a scratch to his hand. There was no medical or lost time.

05/27/16 Utilities - Maintenance Mechanic - The employee was using a pole saw to cut branches from trees when pieces of wood and dust fell from above and into the employee's eyes. The employee flushed his eyes out with water and did not notice any irritation until after work. The employee was wearing safety glasses at the time of the incident. The employee sustained irritation to the eyes. Medical was not sought via Workers' Compensation.

## **5. REVIEW OF AUTO LOSS CLAIM LOG**

04/06/15 Claim #15090 - Amanda McCarty - Police - While driving Unit #121 in the center lane approaching a green light at Port St. Lucie Boulevard and U.S. 1, a vehicle in the right lane began to switch to the center lane, crossing into the path of #121 causing damage to its right front quarter panel. There were damages in the amount of \$5,822.62, Ascension and subrogation.

04/12/16 Claim #15096 - Finley Ricard - Building - Paul Ghiotto - The employee arrived on a job, and thinking the truck was in park, got out of the vehicle. The vehicle rolled forward striking a worker standing directly in front of the vehicle. B-0827 sustained a small dent on the hood of the vehicle. There were no damages and the department will not repair. Ms. Sisilli queried, "Was the vehicle dented by the employee?" Mr. Power responded, "By the man jumping while he was trying to get out of the way."

04/15/16 Claim #15098 - Rodney Dobler - Police - Robert Berger - While backing from the entrance driveway of Port St. Lucie High School, a vehicle was entering. The employee backed Unit #146 into the driver's side front corner of the claimant's vehicle. Unit #146 sustained damage to the rear driver's side bumper. There were damages in the amount of \$2,132.27, and Ascension.

04/16/16 Claim #15097 - Colin Duncombe - Police - While driving southbound on Rosser, a vehicle ran a red light at Aledo, T-boning patrol vehicle #46 on the front driver's side. Damages were in the amount of \$22,744.50. There was Ascension and subrogation. The vehicle was a total loss.

04/21/16 Claim #15104 - Jose Serbia - Public Works - Ranger - Asphalt patching truck, PW-4160, was at the Ranger facility being filled with asphalt. After the truck was filled, the employee pulled off the scale. In doing so, the truck's passenger side step and exhaust shield caught the I-beam guardrail of the scale house. There was no damage to the guardrail. There were damages in the amount of \$358.57.

## **SAFETY REVIEW BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

**JUNE 16, 2016**

04/21/16 Claim #15105 - Jose Montero de Oleo - Public Works - While doing his walk around inspection of PWD-4284, the employee noticed damage to the fender, directional light and hood. The incident is said to have happened on a prior shift from another vehicle and driver. Damages were in the amount of \$2,711.83, paid by the department. There was Ascension. Vice Chair Frye asked, "Did they ever determine who the other employee was?" Chair Perkins responded in the negative.

04/22/16 Claim #15099 - Martin Curran - Police - While exiting FVS, Unit #18's driver side door struck the steel safety post located near the FOB panel. Unit #18 sustained a small dent and scratch. Department will not repair. There was no damage to the post.

04/22/16 Claim #15101 - Christina Rosko - Police - While making a left-hand turn onto SW Whittier from SW Franklin Street, the employee misjudged the turn and struck the front left corner of a vehicle stopped at the stop sign at the said intersection. The City vehicle sustained damage to the driver's side of the car. There were damages in the amount of \$4,256.87, covered by the department. There was Ascension.

04/24/16 Claim #15106 - Norman McDaniels - Utilities - The employee filled diesel truck, US-6826, with unleaded fuel. There were damages in the amount of \$242.00, paid for by the department.

04/25/16 Claim #15100 - Trevor Horten - Police - While traveling south on SW Dinner Street, a dirt bike pulled onto the road from a vacant lot, striking the passenger side, rear door of Unit #246. Unit #246 sustained a small dent and scrape to the door. There were no damages. The department will not repair.

04/26/16 Claim #15102 - Robert Daniel Voegtlin - Police - While in pursuit of a vehicle, the employee attempted to negotiate a curve in the road. While doing so, the employee's vehicle left the roadway, striking the mailboxes at 1705 and 1722 SW Monterrey Lane. There were no damages.

04/27/16 Claim #15103 - Steven Barton - Public Works - While positioning PWD-1850 at the edge of the roadway, PWD-1850 struck the mailbox at 891 Hamberland Avenue. There were no damages to PWD-1850.

05/02/16 Claim #15109 - Joseph Trevisol - Police - FOP #118 - While entering the driveway of 997 SW South Macedo Boulevard, the employee's vehicle, Unit #28, struck the corner post of a chain-link fence located on the property. Unit #28 sustained a minor scuff mark to the vehicle bumper. The department will not repair.

05/22/16 Claim #15110 - Brian Boice - Police - St. Lucie County Fire District - While parked in the roadway, the employee had the driver side door of Unit #181 open, causing a passing fire truck to strike it. The door was bent backwards. Damages were in the amount of \$1,579.65, paid by the department. There was Ascension.

## **6. REVIEW OF GENERAL LIABILITY CLAIM LOG**

04/02/16 Claim #15051 - Charles Corral - Utilities - While working at 1634 SW Pancoast Street, the employee backed a backhoe into the mailbox across the street at 1641. The mailbox was repaired in-house. There were damages in the amount of \$45.00 and there was Ascension. There was no damage to the backhoe.

04/12/16 Claim #15053 - Finley Ricard - Building - The employee arrived on a job, and thinking the truck was in park, the employee got out of the vehicle. The vehicle rolled forward striking a worker standing directly in front of the vehicle. The worker initially advised he did not sustain any injuries, but later sought treatment. There was Ascension. Mr. Power stated, "We're going to wait to see what those costs are. Is this the one where the person got an attorney?" Mr. Dolan replied in the affirmative.

04/15/16 Claim #15054 - Rodney Dobler - Police - While backing from the entrance driveway of Port St. Lucie High School, a vehicle was entering. The employee backed Unit #146 into the driver's side front corner of the claimant's vehicle, cracking its headlight and bumper. Damages were in the amount of \$2,310.63. There was Ascension.

Mr. Power said, "I want to go back to Finley Ricard. You all are so quiet today; no one has asked any questions. Basically, the Building Inspector pulled up, he got there and the other guy was already there, so he started looking around, started checking his work on his tablet. He just forgot to put it in gear." Chair Perkins inquired, "Who did he run over?" Mr. Power answered, "There was a construction worker who was standing at the back of his truck, so he pulled up right behind it." Mr. Dolan added, "The guy was working on plans on his tailgate and Mr. Ricard pulled up behind him. He heard the door close, turned around to look and saw the car rolling towards him." Chair Perkins asked, "Is it the construction worker who has the lawyer?" Mr. Dolan responded in the affirmative. Mr. Power stated, "Obviously, this is very preventable if the employee had taken his time to put it in gear."

04/21/16 Claim #15059 - Jose Serbia - Public Works - Asphalt patching truck, PW-4160, was at the Ranger facility being filled with asphalt. After the truck was filled, the employee pulled off the scale. In doing so, the truck's passenger side step and exhaust shield caught the I-beam guardrail of the scale house, damaging PW-4160. There were no damages to the guardrail. Chair Perkins stated, "Joe Reilly went to the scale house and they said it as normal for people to run over that I-beam. Because of where it is set, if you aren't dead-center on that scale and you go to pull out, you're going to run over something. They've got guardrail all around with I-beams for dump trucks and everything else. Fortunately, it only cost us \$300-some-odd dollars to fix our truck. Now they know to pull up and look before they pull out."

04/22/16 Claim #15055 - Christina Rosko - Police - While making a left-hand turn onto SW Whittier from SW Franklin Street, the employee misjudged the turn and struck the front left corner of a vehicle stopped at the stop sign at the said intersection. The vehicle sustained damage to the front driver's side corner of the vehicle. There were damages in the amount of \$5,249.92, and Ascension.

Mr. Power said, "This is one where the officer cut the corner too close. As she cut the corner, the other car was there and she just caught the front of it. Again, something completely preventable if she had taken her time and swung a little wider." Mr. Frye said, "Turn on your side of the road." Ms. Sisilli stated, "It must be embarrassing being a Police Officer in a police vehicle and hitting another vehicle." Mr. Power noted, "This was an unmarked vehicle."

04/26/16 Claim #15057 - Robert Daniel Voegtlin - Police - While in pursuit of a vehicle, the employee attempted to negotiate a curve in the road. While doing so, the employee's vehicle left the roadway striking the mailboxes at 1705 and 1722 SW Monterrey Lane. A temporary mailbox was replaced in-house by Public Works. There were damages in the amount of \$123.56, and Ascension. Chair Perkins said, "We went out there and replaced two mailboxes." Mr. Nadasi said, "Maybe the mailbox was moved." Chair Perkins said, "It's in the curve where it's supposed to be." Officer Boham stated, "They were in pursuit, so I'm assuming they were going at a high rate of speed."

04/27/16 Claim #15058 - Steven Barton - Public Works - While positioning PWD-1850 at the edge of the roadway, PWD-1850 struck the mailbox at 891 Hamberland Avenue. The mailbox and post were replaced by Public Works. There were damages in the amount of \$50.98, and Ascension.

05/02/16 Claim #15060 - Joseph Trevisol - Police - While entering the driveway of 997 SW South Macedo Boulevard, the employee's vehicle, Unit #28, struck the corner post of a chain-link fence located on the property. The fence post was bent in the collision. There were no damages, but there was Ascension. The City is waiting for an estimate from the FOP president.

05/02/16 Claim #15061 - Jason Hernandez - Utilities - While backfilling at 679 SW Cynthia Court, the employee struck and damaged the mailbox at the said address with the backhoe's outrigger. There was no damage to the backhoe. Damages were in the amount of \$73.39, and Ascension.

05/22/16 Claim #15063 - Brian Boice - Police Officer - While parked in the roadway, the employee had the driver side door of Unit #181 open, causing a passing fire truck to strike it. The fire truck sustained damage to the passenger side. There was Ascension, and as of June 14, the City has not received an estimate.

Officer Boham stated, "This incident had a little gray area because we were pulled over on the side of the road. The employee had just gotten out of the car to allow another employee to enter the driver's seat to review a report. But there is a State Statute that shows essentially the move-over law. If you see an emergency vehicle, tow truck, utility vehicle pulled over on the side of the road, regardless of lights on top, you have to make way, slow your speed and go around the vehicle. Then there is a rebutting Florida State Statute that says that the vehicle, even if the door is open on the car, you have a reasonable amount of time. For instance, in the Publix parking lot, if you see someone with a car door open, it doesn't mean you can just run right into it. Everyone has a reasonable amount of time to get in and out of their vehicle. In this case, our vehicle was the at-fault vehicle because the door was open." Chair Perkins inquired, "Was the

fire truck going somewhere?” Officer Boham replied, “Yes, they were going a couple of houses down. Ascension and the Fire District agreed on a 50% split because it was kind of gray. They are paying for 50% of ours, we’re paying for 50% of theirs.”

## **7. REVIEW OF PROPERTY LOSS CLAIM LOG**

04/24/16 Claim #15134 - Ryan Klein - Utilities - Field Technician Trainee - While tapping a 16” water main, the main broke, filling the hole with water too fast to save the drill. There were damages of \$2,700.00, and Ascension.

04/26/16 Claim #15129 - Steven Peyman - Utilities - Utilities Inspector - While doing an inspection, the employee tripped and struck the iPad he was carrying with his hand. The iPad received a crack in the corner but works correctly. There were no damages.

Ms. Shutt said, “Going back to the Police Officer who hit the chain-link fence going in the driveway. Was that close to the curb?” Officer Boham responded in the affirmative. Ms. Shutt stated, “If I remember correctly, a fence is not supposed to go past the front of the house.” Officer Bonham said, “It was on the side of the yard. This is a property that is on the corner of Macedo and I’m not sure what the other cross-section is. The fence is on the side of the house and the driveway is a big quarter-circle from one road to the other. The corner comes out and is almost right up against the driveway.” Mr. Power added, “This is a commercial establishment, too. It’s the FOP building.”

## **8. OLD BUSINESS**

There was nothing heard under this item.

## **9. NEW BUSINESS**

Chair Perkins stated, “Joe Reilly is the Compliance Supervisor and Safety employee now in Public Works. He has taken my position, so I’m going to fade away in the back-works. From now on, Joe Reilly will be coming here.” Mr. Reilly asked, “Where are you going? What will you be doing?” Chair Perkins replied, “I’ve got more jobs to do, but I’ll be coming in and out. If Joe can’t make it, I’ll be here. If you need anything that has to do with safety, he’s the one you need to go to.”

Mr. Dolan announced, “I will be out of Safety Review Board also because I going to be moving from Risk Management to Public Works as of July 11<sup>th</sup>.” Mr. Reilly asked, “What will you be doing there?” Mr. Dolan answered, “I will be the Administrative Assistant.” Ms. Sisilli inquired, “Is this your last meeting?” Mr. Dolan replied in the affirmative. Ms. Sisilli said, “I hear that they make you learn how to do swale liners and stuff.” Chair Perkins added, “We’ll make him mix concrete, too.” Mr. Reilly asked, “Are you going over to the trailer?” Chair Perkins answered, “No, he’ll be over at Building B.” Mr. Dolan stated, “I’ll be Jim Angstadt’s assistant. The person hired to replace me will start on July 5<sup>th</sup>.”

Vice Chair Frye noted, “Our next meeting will be August 18<sup>th</sup>.” Mr. Power stated, “We’ll make sure we do introductions for everybody.”
