A Regular Meeting of the SAFETY REVIEW BOARD of the City of Port St. Lucie was called to order by Vice Chair Frye on April 21, 2016, at 9:00 a.m., in the 3rd Floor Training Room, Port St. Lucie City Hall, 121 SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, Port St. Lucie, Florida.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – FEBRUARY 11, 2016

There being no corrections, the minutes were unanimously approved.

4. REVIEW OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION CLAIM LOG

02/03/16 – Police – Police Officer – After a motorist drove into the City Hall pond, the employee entered the water up to his knees to assist in removing a driver from the water. In doing so, the employee was splashed with muddy pond water. There was exposure to pond water on multiple body parts, head, and hands. There was no lost time and no medical.

02/03/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee, while clearing a house, felt an insect sting on his left hand. The employee dismissed it as a mosquito, however, a few days later the area of the bite became inflamed and infected. The employee sustained an insect bite to the hand and there was medical.

02/03/16 – Police – Police Officer – After a motorist drove into the City Hall pond, the employee entered the water up to his knees to assist in removing a driver from the

water. In doing so, the employee was splashed with muddy pond water. There was exposure to pond water on multiple body parts. There was no lost time and no medical.

02/03/16 – Parks and Recreation – Building and Facility Maintenance Worker – The employee indicated that during setting up for an event, his right shoulder began to hurt after lifting and moving numerous tables, chairs, and other items. The employee sustained a strain and a sprain to the shoulder. Mr. Power said, “The recommendation on the report was to take your time and ask for help, if you need to. This one was short of a rush job that had to get done, so that is how that one occurred.”

02/03/16 – Utilities – Plant Operator Trainee – The employee was digging with a shovel and felt his back stiffen up. The employee sustained a strain and a sprain to the back. Medical attention was offered, and the employee was put on restricted duty outside of the department for 62 days.

02/03/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee was completing a mountain bike course for recertification training. He encountered an obstacle, which caused him to leave the trail and fly over the handle bars into trees and roots. Upon landing, the employee sustained a broken arm, right ankle strain, shoulder sprains, and multiple cuts and abrasions on multiple body parts. The employee sustained multiple physical injuries on multiple body parts. There was medical, and 26 days of lost time with 36 days of restricted duty within the department.

02/04/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee was completing a mountain bike course for recertification training. He encountered an obstacle, which caused him to leave the trail and fly over a berm. The pedal from the bike lacerated the calf of his right leg when he landed. The employee also received multiple cuts and abrasions to his arms, legs, and torso. The employee sustained a laceration to the calf and an abrasion and cuts to multiple body parts. There was medical, and one day of lost time with 11 days of restricted duty.

02/04/16 – Public Works – Maintenance Technician – The employee was installing a swale liner when he slipped and fell in the mud and bruised his knee. He sustained a contusion to the knee. There was no lost time and no medical.

02/08/16 – Parks and Recreation – Turf Landscape Specialist – While putting away a strap in a new trailer, the lid fell and banged her left thumb on the latch. The sustained a contusion and bruise on her finger. There was no lost time.

02/09/16 – Utilities – Customer Service Specialist – The employee indicated that he was moving files by opening and closing cabinet drawers and felt a strain to his right shoulder. He reported the incident to his supervisor on February 19, 2016. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the shoulder. Mr. Power said, “He should have reported the incident to the supervisor. That was ten days after the fact, so we try remind the employees to report something as soon as it happens. Ten days is a lot of time, and a lot of other things can happen in between the time of the incident and the time you report it.”

02/11/16 – Public Works – Maintenance Worker – The employee reached into the hole to find out how many cables there were, and was shocked. The employee was not wearing any gloves or PPE for protection. The employee sustained an electric shock to the hand. There was no lost time or medical. Mr. Power stated, “He should have been wearing gloves, and should not have been reaching into a place where he could not see. He was counseled on that.”

02/16/16 – Utilities – Plant Operator – The employee was moving boxes at the North Port Booster Pump Station. While repositioning the boxes, the employee felt a twinge in his back as he stood up and turned towards the box. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the back. There was medical and six days of restricted duty.

02/19/16 – Police – Program Facilitator – The employee was processing a domestic friendly kitten for intake. While scanning the cat for a micro-chip, the kitten became startled and suddenly turned and scratched employee’s right hand. Gloves were not being worn at the time of the intake. The employee sustained scratches to the hand. There was medical.

02/19/16 – Public Works – Construction Inspector – The employee was in his vehicle on Port St. Lucie Boulevard when another vehicle rear-ended his vehicle. The employee indicated he had some slight pain in his lower back and a strain to his lower back. There was medical and restricted duty for six days.

02/19/16 – Public Works – Heavy Equipment Operator – The employee was unchaining a Kaiser machine from the trailer when he went to walk around the right side of the trailer. He tripped on something unknown and started to fall. He went to catch himself and used his left arm, which bent up and back. At that point, he felt something pull on his shoulder. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the shoulder. There was medical and restricted duty for six days within the department.

02/20/16 – Parks and Recreation – Park Leader – The employee was trimming Roebelenii Palm Trees and one limb fell and struck the employee’s right forearm. The two contributing factors were that the employee was trimming branches over his head and it was a windy morning. The employee sustained a wound to his forearm. There was medical.

02/22/16 – Utilities – Maintenance Mechanic – The employee was walking across a metal grate at the front door, and tripped on the raised grate and twisted his left foot. A contributing factor was that the employee was reading work orders as he was walking out the front door. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the foot. There was medical and 34 days of restricted duty.

02/25/16 – Utilities – Maintenance Mechanic – The employee was sprayed in the face with sewage water when he opened a ball valve on a discharge line to let the pressure off the line. There was exposure to sewer water in the face. Mr. Power asked, “Do they have PPE’s they are supposed to be wearing when they do that?” Mr. Meagher replied, “Yes, they are supposed to be wearing splash guards for their face. The employee has been notified of it.”

02/29/16 – City Manager – Executive Assistant – The employee was picking up a paper cutter when her left index finger made contact with the cutter blade. The employee sustained a cut to her finger. The employee sustained a laceration to her index finger. There was medical and she was on restricted duty for 7 days. Mr. Power said, “She grabbed it by the handle and it came loose.”

03/01/16 – Public Works – Project Coordinator – The employee was moving an older piece of fiber optic slicing equipment when a strand of fiber optic silica glass became stuck in his hand. Mr. Power stated, “The last person that used the machine did not properly clean it, as glass strands remained on the equipment. The equipment is normally handled without gloves, so cleaning the machine after every use is very important.” The employee sustained a wound to the hand. There was medical and no lost time or restricted duty. Mr. Power said, “According to the person who cut his hand, he was the person who used it last. Mr. Perkins reminded him to clean the chain afterwards.”

03/01/16 – Utilities – Field Tech Trainee – The employee was kicked in his left hand by a resident. The resident was angry his water was being shut off. There was no medical. Mr. Power said, “There is not an incident report. I guess the police were notified.”

03/01/16 – Public Works – The manager at Public Works indicated that approximately two weeks prior to reporting the incident, the employee’s right pointer finger was experiencing numbness, stiffness, and tremors. There was numbness to the hand and there was medical indicated. Mr. Power said, “They ended up replacing her mouse with a penguin.” Mr. Meagher stated, “It is an ergonomic friendly mouse that is upright, instead of sideways like a normal mouse.” Mr. Power pointed out, “It stands up.” Mr. Dolan explained, “It is kind of like a joystick, so your wrist isn’t pronated.”

03/07/16 – Utilities – Municipal Mechanic – The employee indicated that he was pumping out a lift station and because of a build of pressure, the hose used to transport the sewage to the truck flew off of the adapter. The employee was sprayed in the face, the mouth, ears, and eyes with sewage water. Medical was offered. Mr. Meagher said, “He was counseled on the use of the PPE.”

03/03/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee was working a private detail at the hospital when he had to restrain a patient. In the process of restraining a patient, the employee noticed that he had blood on his hands. There was exposure to body fluids on the hands. There was medical.

03/03/16 – Public Works – Inspector – The employee was working on the median on Becker Road, east of Village Parkway. He stepped from the grassy median onto the road and rolled his right ankle. The employee sustained a sprain to the ankle. There was no medical or lost time.

03/03/16 – Utilities – Field Technician Trainee – While being helped out of the hole by another employee, the employee his their wrist pop. The wrist later became swollen and painful. The employee sustained a strain and a sprained wrist. There was medical, and 32 days of restricted duty.

SAFETY REVIEW BOARD MEETING MINUTES

APRIL 21, 2016

03/04/16 – Public Works – Maintenance Worker – The employee had been on a ladder and was rehangng wind screening on a fence. While stepping down, he missed the last two rungs and fell. He landed on his left side, straining his left shoulder and left hip. He sustained a strain/sprain to the shoulder and strain/sprain to the hip. There was medical and restricted duty of 32 days as of April 5, 2016. There will be lost time, as surgery is anticipated.

03/07/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee assisted in the arrest of a subject. After the subject was arrested, he claimed to have some type of staph infection. There was exposure. There was no medical and no lost time.

03/07/16 - Police – Police Officer – The employee assisted in the arrest of a subject. After the subject was arrested, he claimed to have some type of staph infection. The employee wore gloves, PPE, while handling personal items of the subject. There was exposure. There was no medical and no lost time.

03/07/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee assisted in the arrest of a subject, who after the arrest, claimed to have some type of staph infection. There was exposure. There was no medical and no lost time.

03/07/16 - Police – Police Officer – The employee assisted in the arrest of a subject. After the arrest, the subject claimed to have some type of staph infection. The employee assisted with the arrest, but wore gloves when contact was made with the subject. The employee's vehicle was used to transport and was later cleaned. There was exposure. There was no medical and no lost time.

03/07/16 - Police – Police Officer – The employee was in the proximity of the subject. After being arrested, the subject claimed to have a type of staph infection. There was exposure. There was no medical and no lost time.

03/09/16 - Police – Police Officer – The employee was investigating a possible burglary of a vacant home. When he was walking through the back patio area, he stepped on what he thought to be a flat solid surface. Instead, it was a pool cover and the employee fell through and forward on the cover, striking his chin on concrete edge of the pool. The contributing factor was that the incident happened at night and there were no lights. The employee sustained a laceration to the chin. There was medical.

03/09/16 - Police – Police Officer – The employee was assisting in the construction of an explosive breaching wall by lifting bags of concrete mixing cement when he felt pain in his right wrist. The pain increased throughout the week and the wrist started swelling. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the wrist. There was medical and restricted time of 22 days, as of April 5, 2016.

03/12/16 – Parks and Recreation – Recreation Manager - Civic Center – The employee was using a staple gun to attach floral sheeting to a stage. The employee shot a staple into her left hand while attaching the sheeting. The employee sustained a puncture to the hand. There was medical.

03/15/16 – Building – Building Construction Inspector – The employee was completing an inspection and was standing next the homeowner's father, who was holding a small dog. The employee reached up to point something out, startling the dog and the dog bit the employee on the left arm. The employee sustained an animal bite to the arm. There was medical. Mr. Power said, "Animal Control was contacted, because I have to do a bite report and quarantine the dog, because he didn't have the shot records."

03/16/16 – Utilities – Customer Service Specialist – The employee stood up from the chair and started to turn around to leave the desk and fell to the ground. Rescue was called and she was transported to the ER. The employee sustained a fractured ankle. There was medical and 20 days of lost time. Mr. Power said, "The shoes that she was wearing were elevated platforms, and it is just one of those things. There wasn't anything that was done wrong or unsafe, it was just the motion of getting up to turn where she rolled her ankle and fractured it."

03/17/16 – Public Works – Equipment Operator – The employee was operating a Gradall when a bug flew into the cab of the vehicle and into his eye and got caught under his eyelid. There was irritation to the eye. There was medical and lost time.

03/18/16 – Parks and Recreation – Park Leader – The employee was inspecting the playground and stepped backwards off of the stairs onto the mulch. He immediately felt pain to right knee. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the knee.

03/21/16 – Public Works – Equipment Operator – The employee was cutting a driveway using a portable saw when he stood upright after the driveway, he felt his knee pop. The pain and discomfort kept increasing throughout the day. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the knee. There was medical, but no lost time.

03/23/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee was working a traffic incident and was walking in the grass towards the vehicle. He stepped into a hole that was completely covered by grass and twisted his knee. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the knee. There was medical and 13 days of restricted duty, as of April 5, 2016.

03/29/16 – Police – Police Officer – The employee was attempting to handcuff a subject when a struggle ensued. The suspect and employee both ended up on the ground. The suspect got up and ran. The employee chased after him and strained his leg. The employee sustained a strain and sprain to the leg. There was no medical and no lost time.

5. REVIEW OF AUTO LOSS CLAIM LOG

02/06/16 – Claim #15070 - Utilities – Cameron Elwood – The employee attempted to put a piece of three-inch PVC pipe into the bed of UWD-6774. The pipe hit the back window and shattered it. The damages are \$225, paid by the department.

02/08/16 – Claim # 15068 – Utilities – Anthony Mignanelli – While loading fill dirt into a dump truck with a backhoe, the bucket caught the dump truck's canvas arm, breaking it.

There was no damage to the backhoe. The damages were \$250, paid by the department.

02/11/16 – Claim #15057 – Julia Tranberg – Police – The employee, in Unit #21, was behind a vehicle preparing to make a right turn from Import to Gatlin. The employee thought the car turned, but it didn't, and she rear-ended Jannet McGarva. Unit #21 sustained damage to the right front light and right front fender. The damages were \$248.54, paid by the department.

02/12/16 – Claim #15058 – Scott Attey – Building Department – The employee was at the Mobile Gas Station on Becker Road when an employee backed into another (unoccupied) vehicle owned by Dianne Putnam. There was no damage to the City vehicle.

02/18/16 – Claim #15059 – Eugene Gibbons – Police – The employee was traveling northbound in Unit #44 on SW Bayshore Boulevard when the vehicle drifted off of the roadway and struck the mailbox of 2089 SW Bayshore Boulevard. Unit #44 sustained minor damage to the side mirror housing. The damages were \$127.06.

02/19/16 – Claim #15060 – John Kwasnicki – Public Works – The employee was traveling eastbound on Port St. Lucie Boulevard in PW-4524. The employee slowed for traffic in front of him and was rear-ended. The damages were \$1,763.31, and there was subrogation.

02/20/16 – Claim #15074 – Cameron Elwood – Utilities – While driving truck US-3133, the employee made a wide U-turn and entered a grassy right-of-way. The truck became stuck in the soggy grass and was towed out by First Vehicle Services. The damages were \$75, paid by the department.

02/25/16 – Claim #15083 – Trevor Horton – Police – While leaving the Police Department, Unit #246's passenger side mirror struck a City recycling bin, breaking the mirror. There was no damage to the recycling bin. The damages were \$200, paid by the department.

02/25/16 – Claim #15064 – Louiyel Leger - Public Works – The employee was repositioning PWD-0240, so other vehicles could pass within the work zone. As he began to back up, he drifted off of the roadway, coming in contact with the mailbox at 761 NW Avens. PWD-0240 sustained no damages.

02/29/16 – Claim #15054 – Gary Osmanski – Public Works – While repositioning the Street Sweeper PWS-2930 in the early morning hours, the employee unknowingly backed into a cement pole, damaging the tail-light. There was no damage to the cement pole. The damage to the vehicle were \$40.60, and covered by the department.

03/01/16 – Claim #15089 – Carmen Capezzuto – Public Works – The employee removed abandoned paint buckets from West Virginia and O'Donnell. The employee placed the cans in the back of PW-5549, which is a SUV, like an Escape, but didn't realize that one of the lids was cracked open, causing oil inside the can to splash out

onto the interior of the vehicle. Mr. Power said, "I believe that the vehicle was cleaned and there should be some costs involved with it. One of the things that was discussed was that he needed to call somebody, especially if it is paint or some sort of liquid and you don't know what it is. It could have been anything, so he was counseled on not picking up those kinds of items, as he didn't have any hazardous protection. He put it inside the vehicle and it spilled, so he was counseled not to do that again and call someone that is equipped to do it."

03/02/16 – Claim #15071 – Aisha Hardison – Police – While in Unit #162 working traffic detail on Tampico Street, next to Unit #121, the employee attempted to pursue a traffic violator. The employee did not realize her tires were turned towards the unit next to her, causing the passenger side of Unit #162 to scrape across the driver's side front corner of Unit #121. PDA to estimate the damage.

03/03/16 – Claim #15072 – Amanda McCarty – Police – While in Unit #121, working traffic detail on Tampico Street, the employee in Unit #162 drove off in an attempt to stop a traffic violator, but collided with the driver's side front corner of Unit #121. PDA to estimate the damage.

03/07/16 – Claim #15076 – Philip Krischke – Utilities – The employee mistakenly filled UM-6825 with unleaded gas instead of diesel gas. The damages were \$231 to the department.

03/09/16 – Claim #15095 – Orlando Betancourt – Public Works – The employee was stopped at a traffic light westbound on Port St. Lucie Boulevard and Floresta in PW-5979 when the employee was rear-ended. The employee pulled over, but the other car continued on. There was no damage to the City vehicle. Mr. Power said, "One of the things that we tell the employees in orientation, and I think it is reinforced over time, is that if you are involved in a traffic accident, stop and call the police. You don't have to be a hero and try to stop anybody if they don't want to stop. We need to have somebody come out and look at the vehicle and the situation. Risk Management gets a call anytime there is a vehicle crash because we have to ask if there is any reason for our employees to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol as part of our Drug Testing Policy."

03/10/16 – Claim #15075 – Erin Smous – Utilities – The employee was exiting I-95 on the southbound ramp and approaching cars stopped at the red light on Gatlin Boulevard in UL-1875. While attempting to come to a stop, the employee's foot slipped off of the brakes, striking the car in front of her. UL-1875 sustained damage to the passenger side headlight and bumper area. There were \$596.08 in damages to the department.

03/15/16 – Claim #15078 – Jack Beever – Public Works – While the employee was backing out from a parking space, the trailer hitch of PW-7387 struck the rear bumper of another vehicle. PW-7387 did not sustain any damages. Mr. Power said, "There was no damage to our vehicle, but there was damage to the vehicle that he backed into. You won't see that under the General Liability, because the employee was running a personal errand, unrelated to City business. The damage he caused that vehicle was not covered by the City. If you drive a City vehicle, it is suggested that you have a

personal rider on your auto insurance. If it was involving City business, we would have covered it. Because it was unrelated to anything he was doing for the City, it falls under your personal insurance. You are personally responsible for that damage.”

03/16/16 – Claim #15083 – Peter Chunn – Police – The employee was exiting the Police Department parking lot, preparing to make a right turn onto Airoso, when a person on a motorized bicycle traveling on the sidewalk northbound struck the unmarked PD vehicle. There were no damages.

03/17/16 – Claim #15087 – John Briney – Police – The employee was backing up the City vehicle at the eastern station and heard a strange noise, but thought nothing of it. About a week later, the employee noticed a ding on the rear bumper of the same vehicle and realized he had backed into the handrail in the eastern station parking lot. There are no damages and the department will not repair.

03/18/16 – Claim #15079 – Marcel Lilavois – Parks and Recreation – While using PK-5849 to pull trailer PKT-10, PKT-10 struck the driver's side of PK-9923. There was no damage to PK-5849 or PK-10.

03/18/16 – Claim #15080 - Marcel Lilavois – Parks and Recreation – While PK-9923 was parked in the yard, trailer PK-10 struck it, damaging the driver's side door and the quarter panel. The damage was \$2,052.20, and Ascension.

03/21/16 – Claim #15082 – Walter Rivas – Utilities – While driving US-6826, the employee made a U-turn and the front tire got stuck in soft dirt. FVS towed US-6826 out. The cost was \$75, paid by the department.

03/26/16 – Claim #15085 – Anthony Gomez – Public Works – While on the job site located at the southeast corner of Bayshore and Crosstown, PW-9909 came in contact with a fire hydrant. PW-9909 sustained minor paint transfer. There was no damage to the hydrant.

03/28/16 – Claim #15086 – Bill Emskamp – Public Works – While installing a side lot pipe, the Gradall's counterweight came in contact with a tree in the adjacent lot, causing damage to the Gradall's steps and safety marker lights. The repairs were made in-house.

6. REVIEW OF GENERAL LIABILITY CLAIM LOG

02/11/16 – Claim #15031 – Julia Tranberg – Police – Police Officer – The employee, in Unit #21, was behind a vehicle preparing to make a right turn from Import to Gatlin. The employee thought the car turned, but it didn't and rear-ended it. The vehicle sustained damage to the rear bumper. There were \$918.46 in damages and Ascension.

02/12/16 – Claim #15032 – Scott Attey – Building Department – Building Construction Inspector – While at the Mobil Gas Station on Becker Road, the employee backed into an unoccupied vehicle. That vehicle sustained damage to the front bumper of \$612.17. It was paid by Ascension.

02/18/16 – Claim #15035 – Euguene Gibbins – Police – Police Officer – The employee was traveling northbound in Unit #44 on SW Bayshore Boulevard when the vehicle drifted off of the roadway and struck the mailbox at 2089 SW Bayshore Boulevard. There was no damage to the mailbox.

02/25/16 – Claim #15039 – Louiyel Leger – Public Works – Maintenance Worker – The employee was repositioning his vehicle so that other vehicles could pass within the work zone. As he began to back up, he drifted off of the roadway, coming in contact with the mailbox at 761 NW Avens. The mailbox and post were replaced by Public Works at a cost of \$59.97, and was reimbursed by Ascension.

03/10/16 – Claim #15041 – Erin Smous – Utilities – Laboratory Technician - The employee was existing I-95 onto the southbound ramp and approaching cars stopped at the red light on Gatlin Boulevard. While attempting to come to a stop, the employee's foot slipped off of the brake, striking the car in front of her. The claimant's vehicle sustained damage to the rear hatch and bumper. The damages were \$2,205.08, and paid by Ascension.

03/11/16 – Claim #15046 – George Ury – Utilities – While backing the tractor to remove dirt from the road, the employee backed into a mailbox at 1965 SE Franciscan Street. The mailbox was repaired in-house at a cost of \$58.58, paid by Ascension.

03/29/16 – Claim #15052- Jeffrey Santamaria – Utilities – Maintenance Mechanic - The employee damaged a water sprinkler line during a conversion install. He was unable to repair it. The homeowner called a company to repair it. The damages were \$351.88, and paid by Ascension.

7. REVIEW OF PROPERTY LOSS CLAIM LOG
