

City of Port St. Lucie Storm Debris Update #5

PORT ST. LUCIE (November 2, 2016) – The City of Port St. Lucie is progressing toward its goal of having all storm-related debris cleared by Friday.

The Debris Management Team has estimated that 72 percent of roadways have been cleaned of storm related vegetative debris.

As crews continue clear debris, residents should avoid placing debris under power lines, near swale liners, mailboxes, sign posts and fire hydrants as these items might be damaged during the collection process.



The map above illustrates the city's zones.

- Zone 1 is 100% complete
- Zone 2 is 100% complete
- Zone 3 is 100% complete
- Zone 4 is 53% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 4, 2016
- Zone 5 is 56% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 4, 2016
- Zone 6 is 36% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 4, 2016
- Zone 7 is 39% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 4, 2016
- Zone 8 is 100% complete
- Zone 9 is 100% complete.
- Zone 10 is 44% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 4, 2016
- Zone 11 is 43% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 4, 2016
- Zone 12 is 56% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 4, 2016
- Zone 13 is 80% complete, Residents can expect to have all streets cleared by November 3, 2016
- Zone 14 is 100% complete
