**The City of Port St. Lucie's Prineville Water Treatment Facility temporarily off-line for maintenance**

PORT ST. LUCIE, Fla. (November 28, 2016) – Port St. Lucie's Utility Systems Department is proud that it continuously provides a safe and high quality water product to our more than 69,000 customers. However, in order to maintain the high water quality, it is sometimes necessary to shut down portions of our water treatment plants for routine maintenance.

For the next week, the Reverse Osmosis system at the Prineville Water Treatment Facility will be temporarily off-line while maintenance is performed. During this period of time, the Prineville Lime Softening treatment system and the James E. Anderson Water Plant will continue to be in full operation.

Customers located in areas south of Prima Vista Blvd. and east of Florida's Turnpike may notice a very slight change in water color. Please be assured that the water continues to be safe to consume and is in compliance with industry standards.
