**City of Port St. Lucie Hurricane Matthew Update #2**  
**Public Notification: Signal Head Removal**

**What:** City of Port St. Lucie

**When:** 5 p.m., October 4, 2016

**Where:** City of Port St. Lucie City Hall

**Why:** To keep Port St. Lucie residents informed about preparations for Hurricane Matthew. Please see this important update:

The City of Port St. Lucie's Public Works Department will begin removing traffic signal heads tomorrow morning in anticipation of the upcoming storm. They are being removed to reduce the likelihood of damage to the signal heads or other property. At least one (1) signal head will remain in place for each direction at each intersection. Please use caution when navigating these or any other intersections. Once the storm has passed, the signal heads will be re-installed. The intersections affected are as follows:

**Port St Lucie Blvd &**

- Floresta Dr.
- Airoso Blvd
- Cameo Blvd
- Del Rio Blvd
- Dalton Cir
- Darwin Blvd
- Tunis Dr.
- Paar Dr.

**Saint Lucie West Blvd &**

- I-95 NB Ramp (East side of overpass)
- I-95 SB Ramp (West side of overpass)

The City of Port St. Lucie wants to remind residents that after the storm, all signals may not be operational due to a loss of power. If a traffic signal is not working, it should be treated like an all-way stop.
