- Why:** The City of Port St. Lucie wants to keep residents informed with the most up-to-date and accurate information regarding Hurricane Matthew. Please see the following updates from key City departments.

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES: Due to the landfill being closed Thursday and Friday, there is no trash collection or recycling Thursday and Friday. Please do not leave out yard debris or your trash curbside.

PARKS AND RECREATION: Community parks will remain open until 10 p.m. tonight, however, some will be unmanned. Neighborhood parks will remain open until dusk today. All parks and City facilities will be closed on Thursday and Friday.

UTILITY SYSTEMS: 264 lift stations are operating normally on FPL service, and all treatment plants are operating normally on FPL service. Residents and customers can reach Utility Systems with utility-related inquiries 24 hours a day at these number: 772-873-6400 and 772-871-5330.

CIVIC CENTER: In addition to no events on Thursday or Friday, the event scheduled for Saturday, the Treasure Coast Downs Syndrome Awareness Group Buddy Walk has been cancelled. This will be rescheduled to October 22, 2016. Amazing Grace Church, scheduled for Sunday, is still scheduled.
