The latest tracks on Hurricane Matthew no longer have the storm looping back toward Florida and have it dissipating in the Atlantic. Therefore, the City of Port St. Lucie will take hurricane shutters off of all of its facilities and buildings on Monday.

The City encourages residents to take shutters off of their homes. City code allows shutters to remain on windows for up to 14 days after a storm.
