**Port St. Lucie announces Florida Department of Transportation
Lane Shifts on Gatlin Boulevard Begin Oct. 23**

What: I-95 Bridge Deck Replacement Project

When: Traffic shifts on Gatlin Boulevard will begin Oct. 23. and last six weeks

Where: Gatlin Boulevard at the bridge deck over I-95

Who: Florida Department of Transportation

Why: The Florida Department of Transportation has notified the City of Port St. Lucie that starting Sunday, Oct. 23, Gatlin Boulevard at the I-95 overpass will undergo nighttime traffic shifts on Sunday through Thursday between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. to facilitate demolition to the I-95 bridge decks. These nighttime traffic shifts are anticipated to last for about six weeks, weather permitting and excluding holidays.

Traffic in either direction will be shifted to utilize eastbound or westbound travel lanes, narrowing traffic down to one lane in each direction and maintaining two-way traffic at all times. Variable message sign boards and orange cautionary signs will be placed in advance to ensure motorists are following the traffic shift.

GATLIN BLVD. TRAFFIC SHIFTS BEGIN OCT. 23

Starting October 23, 2016, Gatlin Boulevard at the I-95 overpass will undergo nighttime traffic shifts Sunday through Thursday between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. to facilitate demolition to the I-95 bridge decks. These nighttime traffic shifts are anticipated to last for approximately six weeks, weather permitting and excluding holidays.

Traffic in either direction will be shifted to utilize eastbound or westbound travel lanes, narrowing traffic down to one lane in each direction and maintaining two-way traffic at all times. During this time, variable message sign boards and orange cautionary signs will be placed in advance of the shifts. Law enforcement will also be present to ensure motorists are following the traffic shift.

This work is part of the I-95 bridge deck replacement project at the Gatlin Boulevard (Exit 118) and Midway Road (Exit 126) overpasses. Work on this project includes: removing & replacing the bridge decks on I-95 over Gatlin Boulevard and CR-712/Midway Road; milling and resurfacing approaches to bridge decks; and re-striping approaches to bridge decks.
